

SCRAPBOOK PAGE

BOOK SHARE 2 – OPTION 1



This Book Share option requires you to create a scrapbook page that captures the main ideas and illustrates the expository text structure of the book you read. Carefully read and follow the requirements listed below.

DUE DATE:

1. Choose a book and read it before the due date. The book you choose to read may not be a book read for another class assignment (such as a read aloud book or a book read for Book Clubs). **The book you share must be a nonfiction book related to Science or American History.** Please ask for suggestions if you need a good book to read for this assignment.
2. When you finish the book, use BookSource to write a review and rate the book. Your review will count for a part of your grade for this assignment.
3. Using 8 ½ X 11 or 12 X 12 colored paper as a background, create a scrapbook page that captures the main ideas and illustrates the expository text structure of the book you read. Include pictures or drawings, words, stickers, and/or other items so that your scrapbook page looks authentic and fun. Find a creative way to show the text structure of the book as you share the main ideas of the book. For example, if your book tells historical events in sequence, you could include a timeline that has pictures and tells about the events in the order they happened. If your book compares and contrasts two things, find a way to show the differences and similarities between those two things on your scrapbook page. Be creative! Do your best to make your scrapbook page look good and be informational to others.
4. Think of a creative way to include the title, author, and genre of your book somewhere on your scrapbook page. Try to make them stand out and be easily noticed. If you read a book about America's history, remember to also identify the era from American history in which your story takes place.
5. On the day of the Book Share, bring your scrapbook page and use it to tell about the book you read.
